Young leaders, young person	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Equipment needed briefed to YP/ESLYL/parents via OSM to take account of uneven ground. • Location/elements/weather to ensure that event can be achievable with social distance. • if unable to, move the event to new area (ie further down the hill or along) or cancel activity if not possible. • Access highdown NT by the Southern Water access road from the lower car park
